IEB Giving Thanks for God's Faithfulness

at Ballyrobert Mission Hall 1959-60

The Mission Hall was packed with ready listeners;
the presence of God was real and truly felt;
the preaching of the Word
was in the power of the Holy Spirit.

At the end of the service the preacher went to the door and waited to shake hands, but no-one moved. So, back he came and started to preach again! In some ways, time stood still.

Such happened on more than one occasion during the mission which Frank Marshall undertook during the period November 1959 to September 1960. The Hall Committee had invited Mr Marshall to come to conduct some meetings, thinking they would finish before Christmas. However, God in His sovereignty planned otherwise and, despite severe difficulties at the beginning, poured out His Spirit in abundance.

How could such a mission be prolonged every night of the week, except Saturdays, for ten months? How could folk do a day's work and be present each night? How could half nights and whole nights of prayer be sustained? Duncan Campbell talks about Revival as being 'saturated with God' and that is the only answer – we were taken up with God. God was the focus – His holiness, His judgment on sin, but also His might and power to save to the uttermost. These were the truths preached again and again. People speculated, gossiped and talked about the mission; and usually came expectant, not knowing what would happen. Strong men were convicted and changed.

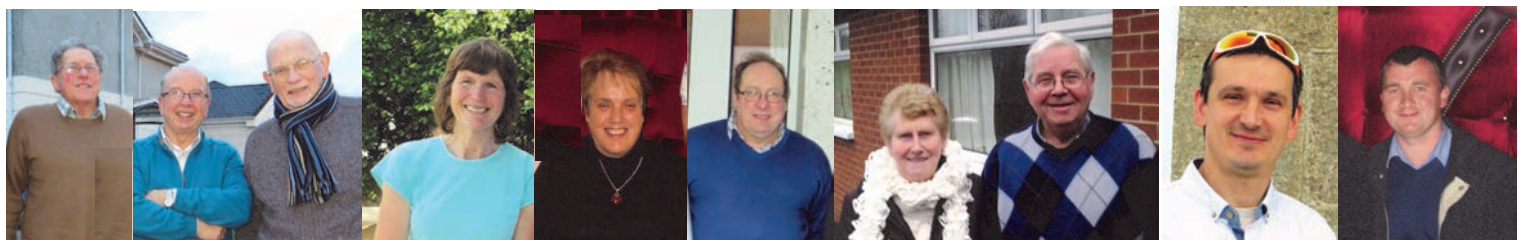

We didn't count numbers, but I am certain at least 100 were converted during that time, resulting in repercussions locally and to the ends of the earth. A number entered full time service. In my case, our family knew household salvation. Of course the devil was interested and active in this mission and some strongly opposed the work; nevertheless there was great joy in what God was doing.

I have often looked back and reflected on those times. For example, the presence of God was terrifying, liberating, simply awesome – oh for such a grip in meetings today! Or again, it was a sad fact that the majority of folk in the village remained untouched, a situation which remains to this day. Why so? Yet people came from all parts of the province and were touched, even converted – a common phenomenon in times of revival. Why so? Or, can what happened be called a Revival or an Awakening? A Revival stirs and revives the hearts of God's people, whereas an Awakening is essentially the conversion of sinners. Both took place at Ballyrobert.

Frank Marshall was God's messenger, herald and preacher in that hour. I recall an old saint, converted under WP Nicholson, saying to me, "I went as often as I could, because every time I went he did my soul good." That happened to me at Ballyrobert and it is what happens in times of revival. I feel privileged to have been present during that time – one never forgets such days and I long for the same again. The fear of God was palpable, prayer vibrant, conviction of sin real and a zeal for the things of God wholehearted. As the old saint prayed – Lord, do it again!

Oh that thou wouldest rend the heavens, that thou wouldest come down, that the mountains might flow down at thy presence (Isaiah 64:1).

A FURTHER VENTURE IN POSTAL DISTRIBUTION IN THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND

In July 2017, *Hope in a Troubled World* booklets were delivered to 663 500 homes in counties Clare, Cork, Galway, Kerry, Laois, Offaly, Sligo, Leitrim, Mayo, Tipperary and Limerick.

The Postal Distribution of *No Longer Hoping* booklets from 2012 to 2015 to 1.79 million homes in every county in the Republic of Ireland was the fulfilment of a vision or burden of IEB to reach the men, women and children of our country with the Gospel message. The response from people who were reached through this Postal Distribution was so encouraging that it was decided that the same means should be employed to distribute another Gospel booklet to homes in every county, city, town, village and rural area of the country. In July, the first stage of the planned placement of 1.79 million copies of

Eight weeks after the Postal Distribution commenced we had already received over 400 reply slips, plus letters from people to whose homes the booklets had been delivered. Bibles, New Testaments, Gospel booklets and tracts were requested and these are now in the hands and homes of many who may never have otherwise been reached with the Gospel. The following excerpt from a letter we received, sums up the value of the Postal Distribution:

"I want to thank you for sending me a Bible which I am reading at the moment. I am 90 years old."

A Shop on the Street

Since our booklet, *No Longer Hoping*, was first printed in 1995, a further thirty publications have been produced, including *Saint Patrick, Patron Saint of Ireland*, *Hope in Troubled Times* and *Hope in a Troubled World*. The first phase of the Postal Distribution of *Hope in a Troubled World* commenced in July.

Overseas

We have endeavoured to 'spread out our nets' even further by translating some of our literature into various languages. For instance, *No Longer Hoping* is currently available in the English, Irish, French, Spanish, Polish and Portuguese languages, and *New Life in Luke* in the Hindi language.

There are over thirty publications available for free download on our website, www.cherithgospel.org. We are encouraged by the number of 'Hits' on the website, which we see as an effective means of 'spreading out our nets' worldwide.
