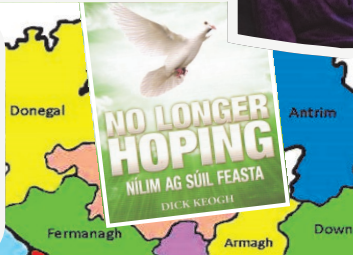

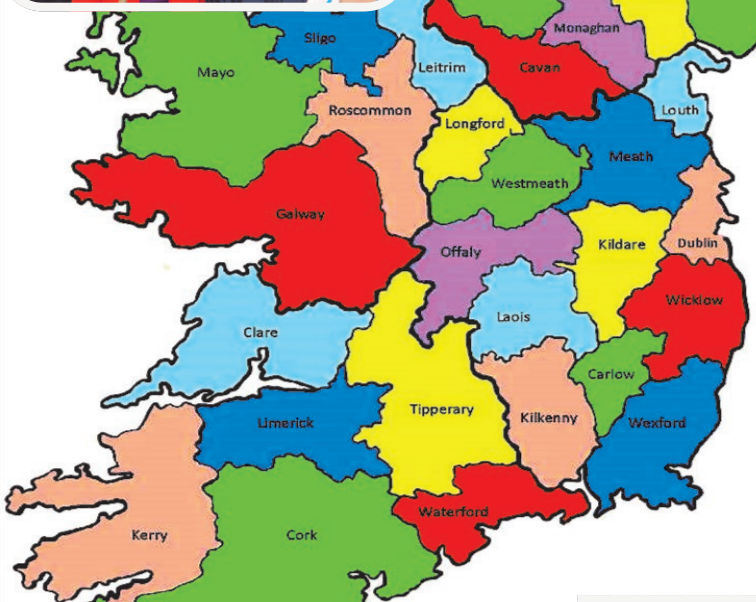

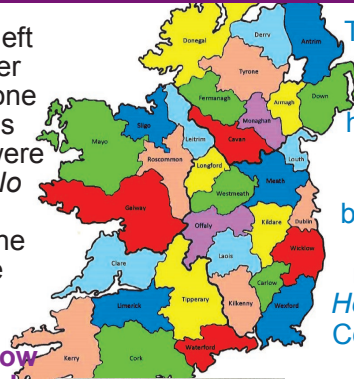

# OUTREACH TO EVERY COUNTY IN THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND

From July 2012 to July 2014 IEB distributed 1.34 Million *No Longer Hoping* booklets through the Irish Postal Service to 25 counties in the Republic of Ireland. IEB completed the distribution to the remaining homes in Dublin in April 2015.

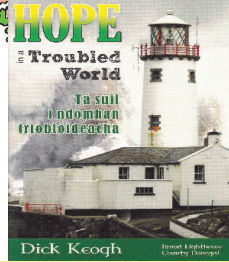
We are reminded in the Scriptures of the shepherd who left the ninety-nine sheep safe in the sheepfold and went after the one that had gone astray. He would not neglect the one that was lost and needed to be reached. As far as he was concerned his work was not complete until he knew all were looked after. The vision of IEB is to place a copy of the *No Longer Hoping* booklet in every home in the Republic of Ireland. Some months ago we were rejoicing that 25 of the counties had been covered. However, there was still one county to be reached and we knew our work was not complete until this was accomplished.



To get the best price with the Postal Service in Dublin it was more economical to post a minimum of half a million booklets. Therefore, in April 2015 we completed the distribution of *No Longer Hoping* booklets in Dublin to 453 600 homes and to make this up to over half a million we posted 59 700 copies of *Hope in a Troubled World* to homes in Co Roscommon and part of Co Mayo.



**We asked you to pray and we now thank God that He has answered prayer and opened the way for the booklet to be distributed in Dublin. Let us now pray that the Good Shepherd, who came to seek and to save that which was lost, will rescue many precious needy souls in the coming days.**

## A Shop on the Street

## The National Ploughing Championships, County Laois, 23 to 25 September 2014



*'Jesus, when He came out, saw much people, and was moved with compassion toward them, because they were as sheep not having a shepherd' (Mark 6:34).*

Such was our scenario this year at The Ploughing Championships - many people, the biggest crowd ever, two hundred and seventy-five thousand people. Were they as sheep without a shepherd? Conversations with the people revealed many who still are depending on the sacraments of the church, others on being good and doing good. Many young people argued their case as to what was truth and what was not. One young thirteen year old, described by her friend as not being religious, denied the existence of God and believed all things came into being with a big bang. Some were sceptical about heaven and hell, and others were holding on to their faith even though they no longer practised it. We did have some people who expressed a deep concern for their soul's salvation.



They were given a fellowship contact in their towns, so please pray for them. Two thousand cups of tea and coffee were served to people. What does that mean? It means we are not left hoping if the people have read the literature given to them. Like Dick Keogh's testimony, we are no longer hoping. We know for sure that at least ninety-nine per cent of those people had the Gospel shared with them across the tables. Yes, sheep without a shepherd, and what a joy to teach them many things about the truth of salvation. This year we were blessed with the labours of an OM team which joined us. It was quite an international team from America, Australia, Canada, Germany, Netherlands and N. Ireland. Together we laboured with the Lord and now look to the Lord for the increase. For those who have been praying for us, continue in prayer for this increase of the Lord.

## John Johnston Reaching out with the Gospel in the West

### Outreach Work

Over these last few months, I visited many villages and towns giving out the 2015 Gospel calendars, a variety of Gospel literature including Gospels of John which incorporate Steps to knowing God and Gospel verse bookmarks. In addition, invitations to the Praise Evenings in Manorhamilton and Bundoran were also distributed. Thirteen people attended the Praise Evening in Manorhamilton where the Gospel songs and the Word of God were enjoyed by all.

In Bundoran, we had a Praise Service in the local nursing home and also in the Allingham Arms Hotel. The singing along with the Bible readings were greatly enjoyed by all who were present.

I have visited several homes and have had opportunities for many meaningful conversations with people, many of them living on their own and dealing



with many issues including bereavement. Outreach work has taken place in Manorhamilton, Glenfarne, Dowra, Rossinver, Killargue,

Drumkeeran, Keshcarrigan, Aughnasheelin, Drumcong, Fenagh and Bundoran.

We are studying the book of Acts at the monthly Praise Evening in Manorhamilton and are encouraged by people sharing what Christ means to them and by the many Gospel musicians and singers who come along. To all who have helped me with the outreach work I say a sincere thank you.

The literature published by Cherith Gospel Outreach Trust is being used in various parts of the world and though we have never set foot in most of these places we feel privileged to be allowed by God to play a small part in the rescue of those who are in danger of being eternally lost. We are, by

God's grace, part of a team of believers dedicated to doing what we can to see men, women, boys and girls snatched from the grip of the devil. A prisoner in Lusaka Central Prison, Lusaka, Zambia, sent us a reply slip from one of our booklets recently. He requested a Bible, literature explaining the Way of Salvation and all of the booklets and tracts mentioned on the reply slip.

Many of the prisoners to whom we have sent literature in the past have shared it with their fellow inmates and some of these have also

contacted us, so we trust this will be the case in this prison also.

We continue to be encouraged by the fact that 1112 people who were contacted through the Postal Distribution of the

booklets have returned reply slips or have written letters to us, many requesting Bibles or New Testaments. *Which Way to God* (by Peter Jeffrey) and *Ultimate Questions* (by John Blanchard) are two of the booklets we send to contacts who request literature explaining the Way of Salvation. Most of the contacts also request booklets and tracts listed on the reply slip.
