In July 2017 *Hope in a Troubled World* booklets were distributed to 663 500 homes in Counties Clare, Cork, Galway, Kerry, Laois, Offaly, Sligo, Mayo, Leitrim, Tipperary and Limerick. We have received 450 very encouraging responses.

IEB in the Past - Rebe Firth in God's Service

I went as a civil servant to Enniskillen and I shall never forget the kindness of Mr and Mrs McClintock to me. It was well-nigh impossible to get accommodation on account of the influx of evacuees and American soldiers.

Mr and Mrs W T McClintock opened their home to me for several weeks until they were able to find 'digs' for me with dear Mrs Crozier of Killyvilly. Through the kindness of the McClintocks, I got in touch with the IEB folk in Enniskillen.

There was a need for a secretary and a headquarters for the IEB and the Lord led me to resign from the Ministry of Home Affairs and to act as secretary to the Band and to try and find accommodation for a headquarters. The Lord also, at that time, laid the need of an Evangelical Bookshop on my heart as the CLC had just been born and the Lord passed the vision on to me. It seemed impossible at that time to get a shop and perhaps more impossible to get a permit to open a new shop, but Hallelujah our God is the God of the impossible and He did just that.

A shop with living accommodation was obtained in Belmore Street and the permit to open it came through in record time in answer to prayer. I shall never forget those early days and can still see dear Mr W H Creighton, hammer in hand, getting that shop into order!

The love, fun and fellowship was so wonderful and God was moving and giving world-wide missionary vision to the saints in Enniskillen. GLORY TO JESUS, since then, the Band has sent missionaries to the uttermost part of the earth.

Shortly after the Bookshop was opened, the Lord gave Mr McClintock the vision of a Convention at Bundoran

and oh, what blessed memories I still have of that first Bundoran Convention under the anointed ministry of Mr Marshall, Mr J D Drysdale, Mr Jock Purves, Mr Maynard James and Mr S T Nelson. They were 'days of heaven on earth'.

When the Lord opened the door for me to go to West Africa, it was very costly to leave the dear IEB.

IEB FOCUS ON IRELAND

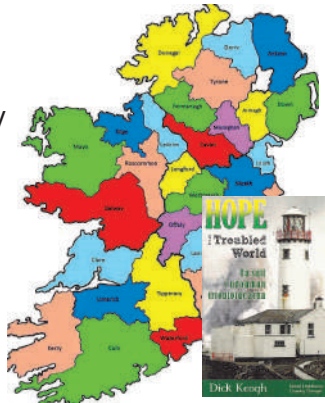
"My comrades, when we, the soldiers and servants whom God has set to the business of saving men, and are prepared to pay the price, we shall see the Divine result, and never 'till then. That is the way and the only way. The perishing and shipwrecked are before your eyes. But they can't be reached and rescued without trouble, and risk,

'If you cannot reach the perishing souls one way, try another.'

This was something the IEB seriously considered in recent years as we prayed for guidance concerning which method we should employ in our efforts to reach the people of Ireland with the Gospel message. The Postal Distribution of *No Longer Hoping* booklets to 1.79 million homes in every county in the Republic of Ireland was the result of our conviction that God wanted us to 'try another way' of reaching the lost. The positive response to this effort has led to the decision to distribute a second Gospel booklet. Stage one of the Postal Distribution of *Hope in a Troubled World* booklets to



homes in every county, city, town, village and rural area of the country began in July 2017. To date, 663 500 booklets have been delivered to homes in counties Clare, Cork, Galway, Kerry, Laois, Offaly, Sligo, Leitrim, Mayo, Tipperary and Limerick.

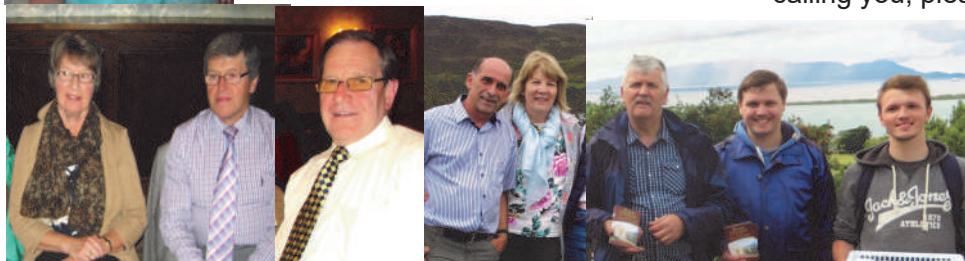

Virginia Mothers' Union where sales were excellent. At a mission in Killeshandra Parish Church, Henry brought a bookstall on two evenings. There was a good crowd and Bibles and other literature were sold. In December Henry had a bookstall at an annual evening in Longford church hall where parents of young people from various churches purchased Christmas cards and gifts. At these events people also received Christian books and Gospel literature free of charge. Quite a lot of people came into the shop to buy gifts for Christmas and our prayer is that these will benefit people spiritually.

The National Ploughing Championships, 19-21 September 2017, Scraggan, Tullamore, Co Offaly



'Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord' (1 Corinthians 15:58).

The official attendance of 291 500 people was indicative of the attraction The National Ploughing Championships had at Scraggan, County Offaly. 1700 exhibitors were there representing their businesses and promoting their products.

It was interesting to see the public going home with bags of free literature. We were there on the King's business. One of the great blessings was to work with a dedicated team of people from all age groups, having the one purpose of sharing their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Some worked in the background, carrying water, washing dishes and cooking for the team. Two ladies served tea and coffee for over 2000 people. It was amazing to see the hunger and openness some people displayed as they listened to personal testimony and a simple presentation of the Gospel over a cup of tea. One lady asked if God could forgive all her sin. It was great to tell her that the Lord had died and shed His precious blood to cleanse her from all sin.

Many Bibles and Gospels of John were eagerly received. Calendars with a verse of Scripture for each month were taken home. Lots of tracts and CDs were distributed. It was so encouraging to see the number of teenagers reached with visual aids by the OM team.

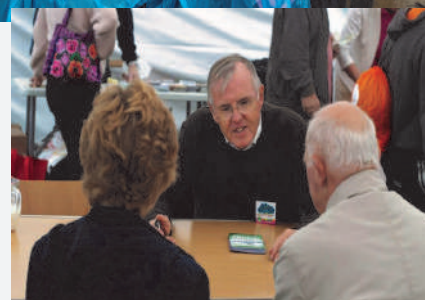

Cherith Gospel Outreach Trust has, since its inception, sought to proclaim this message to precious needy souls: The depravity of man as a consequence of the fall, and his need of forgiveness, mercy and redemption through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Making an impact in Ireland

Some of the Gospel booklets and tracts which the Lord has enabled us to write are specifically suitable for evangelism in Ireland. The following were used in the early days of our outreach and are



still in circulation: *No Longer Hoping* and *No Longer Searching* (published in 1995), *Nílím ag Súil Feasta and Achill Island, Famine, Eviction and Emigration* (1998). Other early publications include *Croagh Patrick, a Place of Hope for the Irish*, *Saint Deirbhile and the Woman at the Well*, *On the Slopes of Slievemore*, *Achill and the Kirkintilloch Fire Disaster*, *The Blessed Virgin and an Irish Family*, *Knock, a Light in the West*, *Achill Island and the Great Storm of 1847*. Many of these were distributed in the West of Ireland by outreach teams, and this work is still ongoing. We have been encouraged by the number of requests for Bibles and Gospel literature from people contacted

through the recent Postal Distribution of *No Longer Hoping* and *Hope in a Troubled World* booklets to homes throughout the Republic of Ireland.

Overseas Outreach

Salvation in Shanty Town is the title of a tract we wrote some years ago for distribution in the largest Shanty Town in the world, which is situated on the outskirts of Cape Town, South Africa. A consignment of Bibles followed shortly. The Portuguese, Spanish, Polish and French translations of *No Longer Hoping* have been used in evangelism in several countries. The Hindi translation of *New Life in Luke* is currently being distributed in India.

Belmullet Teams on Outreach 18-27 November 2017

There were six of us involved in the week of outreach. It was our privilege to distribute Gospel calendars, Gospel literature and invitations to the two Carol Services. Although it was a week of mixed weather it was usually not bad while we visited from home to home. 2017 was a year of at least two tragic events in the Belmullet area. In March a rescue helicopter crashed at Blackrock, a small island lying a few miles off the coast of the peninsula, with the loss of the four crew members on board. In September three members of a family from the area were tragically killed in a road accident. These events were on the minds of some of the people with whom we chatted. We trust that God will use these tragic events to help people realise the brevity and uncertainty of life and their need to prepare for eternity. We held a Carol Service at the Heritage Centre in Eachleim on Thursday evening when eleven local people attended. Our second Carol Service was at the Broadhaven Bay hotel with fourteen locals in. Neil Shaw sang some carols, we sang carols together, some of the people who attended did Bible readings

of the Christmas story and we shared some thoughts about the Christmas message. We also visited the Wheelchair Centre, the Community Hospital and Ti Aire care home to sing carols and do a Christmas Bible reading with the residents. We thank God for His blessing and protection on us during our time.

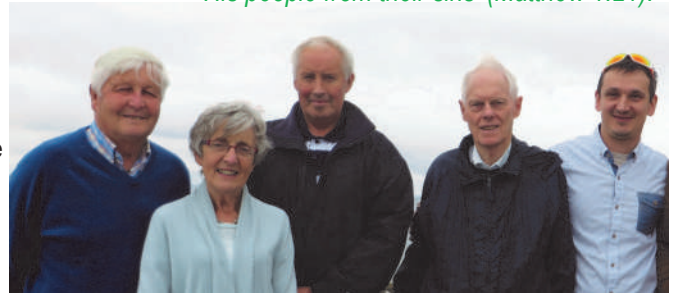
That God will use the tragic events of 2017 to speak to people about their need to prepare for eternity.

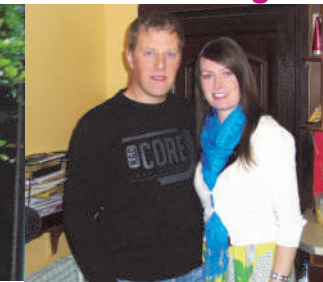
